WELCOME SUMMER

Businesses and citizens of Cimarron, summer is fast approaching. Over 22,000 participants are signed up to be at Philmont this summer.

Many of these participants, along with seasonal staff will be coming into Cimarron. Let us welcome them. Many of you have already had the pleasure of meeting the new General Manager, Roger Hoyt and his wife Diana.

With the addition of Cimarroncita, Philmont's official area is now 140,177 acres.

HUMMINGBIRDS

Birds are attracted to the red coloring of the feeders making the addition of red food coloring unnecessary. Although not a proven fact, some studies have shown the red dye may thin the shells of the hummingbird eggs. Rather than take a chance, omit the dye.

Keep feeders clean and refill regularly as sugar water ferments in just a few days. Feeders are best hung out of direct sunlight. Mix 1 part sugar to 4 parts of boiling water to dissolve sugar and cool. Store extra mixture in the refrigerator.
